



## WHAT IS AVID ?

Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) is an academic regularly scheduled elective class designed to prepare students for entrance into a four-year college or university immediately after high school.

The AVID curriculum focuses on helping students to develop college level skills in:



In addition, students partake in university field trips and motivational activities including guest speakers and various projects. Students receive scheduling assistance to ensure they are scheduled in appropriate honors, IB and advanced placement (AP) courses.

Current information on financial planning for college including scholarship grant and student loan resources will be provided as well as college application advice and assistance.

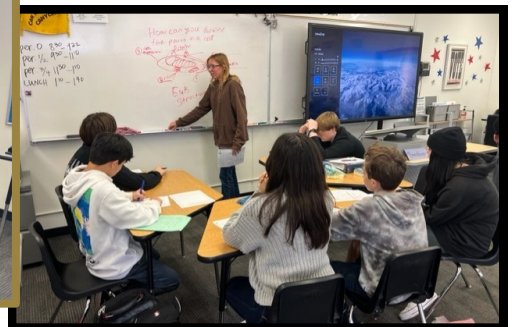
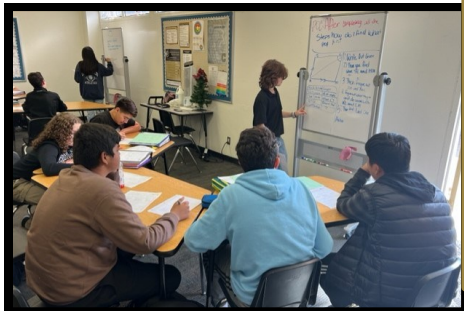
AVID students learn to work cooperatively as a support system for each other and a trusted school "family unit". The AVID program functions to ensure that students will succeed in a rigorous curriculum and be fully prepared to apply and enroll in college.

## AVID STATISTICS...

- 90% of students who have graduated from a high school AVID program have enrolled in a four-year college or university.
- Two years later, 84% of those students are still enrolled in a higher education facility.
- 94% of AVID graduates have completed or exceeded the A-G requirements for college compared to 34% of California graduates.
- 100% of AVID students graduate high school.
- AVID students graduate high school with an average GPA of 3.4.

## AVID QUALIFICATIONS

Students must:

- Have a desire to attend a 4 year university
- Complete required college-prep courses (A-G requirements) and the AVID elective each year
- Must earn a C or higher in all A-G courses
- Be willing to take honors, AP &/or IB classes
- Take college entrance exams if required
