Sample Four-Year Plan

The table below represents a sample four-year plan for math, science, and medical classes required to complete the Medical Academy. Academy graduates should complete four years of math, science, and medical science coursework to complete the academy and qualify for a stole to wear at graduation. Students should work closely with their counselors to incorporate appropriate honors, IB and AP courses, as well as other graduation and A-G required courses.

Course Descriptions:

Medical Core UC-G (02): Deepens student knowledge of medical terminology, human growth & development, body systems, common diseases and disorders, medical math and bio-safety. Students gain practical experience in Vital Signs, Emergency Medical Care, First Aid, and CPR.

Body Systems & Disorders UC-G (03): This class covers human anatomy and physiology, normal body system functions and diseases, and disorders of those systems.

Sports Medicine I UC-G (02): Prepares students for the Sports Medicine through study of anatomy, physiology, and bodily systems. Students expand scientific knowledge in the evaluation, assessment and care of injuries, as well as preventative techniques, and wellness.

Sports Medicine II Internship (03): A competency-based course preparing students for an entry-level job in sports medicine. Students are provided advanced classroom instruction by the Canyon Certified Athletic Trainer when working athletic events.

Professional Internship (03): Allows students to apply academic knowledge 21st-century employability skills in a work-place setting. Students will prepare job readiness documents and interview at an assigned site prior to interning with a local Canyon Business Partner.

UCCI Spanish 4 Patient Care UC-E (03): A level four Spanish course that prepares medical caregivers to communicate with Spanish-speaking patients using medical terminology, anatomy, physiology, and patient assessment fusing the medical responder with the medical communicator. Students can earn their Bi-literacy seal.
