

Sample Four-Year Plan

The table below represents a sample four-year plan sequencing the required classes to complete the Education Pathway. Students must complete a level 02 & 03 course to be a pathway completer and earn a tassel to wear at graduation. Students should work closely with their counselors to incorporate appropriate honors, IB and AP courses, as well as other graduation and A-G required courses.

Education Pathway Course Descriptions:

Career Focus Education (01): Explores college and career opportunities in the field of Education and Family Services.

Child Development UC-G (02): Students study and explore the healthy physical, socio-emotional, and cognitive aspects of human development from conception to early adulthood.

Careers in Education UC-G (03): This course prepares students for a career as a teacher. Students will learn classroom management, instructional strategies, lesson planning, and more. As a part of this course, students will apply these skills in a paraprofessional internship experience at a local elementary or secondary school.

STEM Teach - Science (03): Students create and design a variety of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics) lessons and teach them to local elementary school students in a classroom setting. Students will also participate in the OCMaker challenge at Chapman University and the Ducks S.C.O.R.E First Flight event at the Honda Center.

Professional Internship (03): Allows students to apply academic knowledge and demonstrate technical 21st-century skills in a workplace setting. Students will prepare job readiness documents and will interview at an assigned site before interning with a local Canyon Business Partner.
