Information about Student Schedules

Required Courses

All freshmen must take 6 courses to stay on track with graduation requirements. Four of the six classes are Math, English, Science and Physical Education. The remaining two courses are electives, which are often a language other than English, a Career Pathway class, or another academic elective.

<u>Health</u>

Health is an online course required for graduation. Students have the option to complete it over the summer before they begin high school or take it for 1 quarter during the school year. Health earns 2.5 credits.

History Classes

Freshman do not take history until sophomore year.

Physical Education

Mandated by the State of California and upheld by OUSD, all freshmen will be enrolled in PE, dance, a sport, Color Guard, Marching Band, or Drum Line for the entire year.

Sports

Freshmen interested in participating in a CIF sport must tryout. Coaches will send the counselors a final roster; you will only be scheduled for the class if you are on the roster. Eligibility is based on a minimum 2.0 GPA every quarter.

Block Schedule

Students attend 3 periods per day organized by ODD and EVEN days. On odd days, students attend periods 1, 3, and 5. On even days, students attend periods 2, 4, and 6. Odd and even days alternate. The block schedule permits approximately 100 minutes of instruction per class.

First/Second Period

Students scheduled in period 1-6 start their day at 9:30 am and end at 3:25pm. There is a break between each period.

Zero Period – Daily class. Starts at 8:30am

A zero period class is an optional course request. Students may choose to take a zero period in order to accommodate 7 classes into their schedule, or to have an early release/short day. Zero period requests are not guaranteed and dependent on availability. In order to have a zero period, students must demonstrate good attendance.

Early Release/Short day

Students who take a zero period, and have 6 classes total, will have an early release day (also referred to as a short day). The zero period takes place of either a 5th or 6th period. Students with a short day are released at lunch.

"Please See Counselor" on Schedule

If "PIs See CounsIr" is listed on your student schedule, please see your counselor during *Taking Careof Business*. Please note that the masterschedule is subject to change at any time prior to the start of the school year. Counselors will fix any issues the first week of school.

Two Course Titles in One Period or Missing period

If students have multiple classes in one period, or are missing a period, they should see their counselor during the period the issue is occurring on the first two days of school.

Schedule Changes

Students have the opportunity to request schedule changes during *Taking Care of Business*. No requests will be taken on the first two days of school. Schedule change request forms will be made available on the first Friday after school starts, and students will have until the following Friday to submit their request(s).

Teacher Change and Period Change Requests

Counselors make it a priority to enroll students in the correct course titles and the number of required classes to meet graduation requirements. Due to scheduling conflicts, we are unable to honor requests.
