FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS about College Apps

- ***I have no idea how to fill out my college applications. Where can I get help?***

Counselors will visit Senior English classes in September with the latest information on college applications and financial aid. Seniors will receive a handout with additional information and resources to take home, and you can also meet with your Canyon counselor individually for more help!

Throughout the next few months, there will be scheduled workshops for seniors to get help on Cal State, UC, and private school applications on the Canyon campus, so stay tuned for those dates.

- ***I think I need letters of recommendation. Where do I begin?***

First, verify that the school(s) you're applying to actually require(s) letters of recommendation. CSUs and UCs do not require any letters of recommendation as part of their admissions process, unless you're applying to a specialized program. Other private and out-of-state schools are specific as to whether they want one or more letters from a teacher and/or a counselor.

If a school requires a letter from a teacher, it is best to ask them directly as soon as possible. Teachers write about what kind of student you are and how you function in the classroom. They may ask for your resume so that they know more about what you do outside of class. If you don't have a resume, you can make one using Resume Builder on *Xello*.

Counselors will have specific instructions and deadlines on how to request letters of recommendation in September. You will have a timeline and questions to answer for your counselor, such as your personal, academic and other accomplishments, how you utilize your time outside of school, and what makes you a good candidate for the specific school(s)/major(s) you're applying to.

- ***Can I get into a UC or CSU with my grades?***

The CSUs and UCs have eligibility requirements that include courses taken in high school (*also known as the "A-G" requirements*), grades in those courses (*must be a C or above*), and an overall GPA (*3.0 minimum for UCs, and 2.5 for majority of CSUs*).

Some campuses and/or majors are harder to get into and will be accepting students with higher grades and more competitive academic profiles than others. Check out last school year's admissions statistics at the end of this packet for specific majors/campuses.

- ***I got a D (or F) in class(es). Does that mean I'm automatically not eligible for the UC or CSU schools?***

Not necessarily. You're required to earn a grade of C or better on A-G courses only, so check your transcript and verify with your counselor to find out what options are available. You can repeat your courses and try to earn a better grade through APEX credit recovery during the school year to meet the requirements.

- ***Should I take the SAT or ACT?***

CSUs and UCs no longer consider SAT or ACT scores for admission to the university. Scores may be used after admission to determine proper placement only if the student has taken the exams.

Some private and out-of-state schools may still require a test score, so check with those specific universities to confirm their requirements or recommendations.

Check the official SAT/ACT websites (collegeboard.org or act.org for specific testing dates and locations to register).

- ***How do I get my ranking for the private or out-of-state school applications?***

Canyon High School uses decile ranking (percentages by 10), and does not provide individual student ranking. Your counselor can provide your decile ranking in mid- September once the school Registrar has completed processing all senior transcripts, which usually takes a few weeks after the school year begins.

- ***I'm worried about paying for college. Are there any scholarships for me?***

Yes! There is money out there for you!

There is need-based and merit-based, free and borrowed financial aid for college tuition. You can apply for federal/state aid by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the California Dream Act Application (CADAA). If the 2025-2026 FAFSA is released as planned on October 1*, 2024, then the priority deadline for the state will be March 3, 2025*. There will be workshops to help students and families to fill out the applications.

Colleges have their own scholarships and financial aid that they award when they accept a student for admission. The college will inform you of this aid after they have accepted you in the form of a financial aid letter.

Most public community colleges offer some type of "Promise Scholarship" which awards free tuition to incoming full-time freshmen for up to two years.

There are also local scholarships available. You can check *Xello* for the latest information or visit Mrs. Grammas in the Canyon Career Center for an updated list.

- ***My application asks for my California SSID. Where can I find it?***

Your ten-digit SSID can be found on your transcript. You can go on Parchment.com and have an unofficial transcript emailed to yourself and find your number that way. You can also ask your counselor.

- ***How do I send an official CHS transcript to the schools (and other organizations for scholarships, etc.) that I'm applying to?***

First of all, check to make sure that the application **requires** an official transcript since each admissions process is different. (For example, UCs and CSUs do NOT require an official transcript until AFTER students have been admitted.) Students (or guardians) must request an official CHS transcript through the Parchment website (www.parchment.com). Once you create an account as a learner, you will have access to an unofficial transcript to view and download. There is a fee to send an official transcript anywhere else, including to yourself.

If you're applying to multiple schools via the Common Application, order one official transcript sent to the Common App itself (using your application ID number) rather than sending it to multiple schools separately.

Frequently Asked Questions about ATTENDANCE

- ***How many days of school can I miss before a doctor's note is needed?***

Students are allowed 14 days as excused absences due to illness per year without a doctor's note. After that, a doctor's note is required to excuse the days missed.

- ***How many days do I, and my guardians, have to clear my absence through the attendance office?***

After 3 days of an uncleared absence, it turns into a truancy, which then converts to detention hours.

- ***How can I clear tardies to avoid detention hours?***

Tardies cannot be cleared, and students must serve one detention hour for each tardy.

- ***What happens when a student has excessive absences?***

When a student has over 10 absences, illness or personal, a letter will be sent to the guardians as a first step towards intervention. The administration may take further steps if no improvement is made.

- ***If I was marked absent by mistake, how can that be fixed?***

If a student is mistakenly marked absent from a class, they can ask their teacher to submit a correction form to fix and clear the absence.

- ***How can I leave campus early for a doctor's appointment?***

Parents or legal guardians can send in a note, call, or come to the attendance window for early releases. We ask that you communicate at least an hour before the time the student is to be dismissed.

Notes for First Time Freshmen (FTF) and Upper Division Transfers (UDT)

Bakersfield: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT. Impacted in nursing (basic) and the RN to BSN nursing programs.

Channel Islands: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT. Impacted in the nursing (basic) program.

Chico: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT. Impacted in nursing (basic) and option in recording arts (BA in Music).

Dominguez Hills: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT.

East Bay: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT. Impacted in the nursing (basic) program.

Fresno: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT. Impacted in nursing (basic), Nursing (RN to BSN), and social work

Fullerton: Impacted for FTF and UDT, and in all undergraduate programs, pre-programs, undeclared/undecided programs.

Humboldt: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT. Impacted in RN to BSN Program.

Long Beach: Impacted in all undergraduate programs, pre-programs for FTF and UDT and undeclared/undecided programs for FTF only.

Los Angeles: Impacted in all undergraduate programs, pre-programs for FTF and UDT and undeclared/undecided programs for FTF only.

Maritime Academy: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT. New students in all majors must complete a physical examination and pass a health review prior to enrollment.

Monterey Bay: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT.

Northridge: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT. Impacted in accountancy, business administration (options in financial analysis, financial planning and risk management and insurance), cinema & television arts, and music.

Pomona: Impacted for FTF and UDT, and programs in animal science, animal health science, architecture, biology, biotechnology, business administration (accounting option), chemistry, civil engineering, communication, computer science, environmental biology, engineering (aerospace, chemical, civil, computer, electrical and mechanical), kinesiology (general option), physics and Sociology (transfer only).

Sacramento: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT. Impacted in business administration (all options), criminal justice (general), graphic design (general), nursing (general), and psychology (general).

San Bernardino: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT. Impacted in criminal justice (all options), kinesiology (pre-physical therapy), psychology, nursing (general), and social work (pre-social work).

San Diego: Impacted for FTF and UDT, and in all undergraduate programs, pre-programs, and undeclared/undecided programs.

San Francisco: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT. Impacted in nursing (general), social work and undeclared/undecided (with an interest in nursing)

San Jose: Impacted for FTF and UDT, and in all undergraduate programs, pre-programs, and undeclared/undecided programs.

San Luis Obispo: Impacted for FTF and UDT in all undergraduate programs (and does not consider alternate majors).

San Marcos: No campus impaction for FTF or UDT. Impacted in programs in biological sciences, business administration, electrical engineering, nursing (basic) and software engineering.
